



Campbeltown Picture House is one of the first purpose built cinemas in Scotland. This Grade-A listed building is unique, with a Glasgow School art nouveau exterior and a wonderful atmospheric style interior. It opened on 26th May 1913 and survives today as a rare space, largely unaltered from the 1935 remodelling by the original architect Albert V. Gardner.



The Picture House closed in 2014 for extensive refurbishment and restoration and re-opened in December 2017. Now a cultural, entertainment and social focus for Campbeltown and Kintyre, benefitting all sections of the community.



There's still plenty we'd like to do including expand our range of equipment for live performances, keep our projectors up to date, send the staff on training courses to help them while at the cinema and in their future careers, offer reduced price screening to local groups who may not be able to use our facilities without a subsidy and of course, maintain this beautiful building.
